As the first quarter of 2024 comes to a close, some of you may be curious to know how closely our receipts are tracking to the amount we need to meet our budget by the end of the year. To bring you up to date, here is a summary of giving so far this year:

#### A story about Edwin from Papua, Indonesia.

He was an IVEP candidate, worshipping at Zion in 2009.


Edwin was a Creation follower. He prayed for God's Creation daily. He knew every bird, animal, fish, tree, insect, leaf, and grain of sand in Papua, Indonesia. He did not know seasons like spring, summer, fall and winter. On the East side of the Island of Java, it was either hot and rainy or hot and dry. Weather there was actually insipid, challenging and tolerated. It was, however, incredibly beautiful.

One day in late September (in Souderton), Edwin noticed the leaves were turning over on the trees. Why do the leaves turn over like this, he wondered. Trees in Papua did not do this. As weeks passed, Edwin noticed bushes losing their bright color and flowers dying, grass turning pale. Our Sun was lower in the sky. Edwin became alarmed. He could no longer hold back his concern. With tears in his dark brown eyes, he asked us, "Why is everything dying outside? The trees are dead. There is no life in them. Birds have gone. Everything is dead or dying." He truly worried his prayers were going unheard.

We explained the four seasons that arrive in North America-- like clockwork. Each season has its own great wonderment. With respect, Edwin did not believe it. He never heard of such things. He continued to fret for the Creation. "These trees will not live again, they are dead," he said as grief took over.

Winter arrived and Edwin, now stunned. He had never breathed air that made his skin and body cold. Snow was a phenomenon beyond his imagination. Shivering was a new experience. He disliked being indoors so much, but he could not tolerate the wintery blasts of frigid air. What's more, all those layers of clothing made him wince. "Spring's coming!" we kept saying. Edwin, unconvinced, looked down.

Late March ushered in some unseasonably warm air for about a week, and soon the daffodils and grape hyacinths were striking a pose just above the soil. Edwin did not miss any of this. But still, he firmly reported the trees were not responding. After work, he spent time sitting with the trees, encouraging them. Patiently waiting a few more weeks, Edwin's prayers were fruitful. Things began to show life! One evening he happily came to the dinner table to proclaim the trees were budding! He could not deny, birds were returning! Now, he was no longer sad. Edwin sat on our stone wall, watching our towering oak tree as it swayed in the warm spring breeze, this time with a smile and a
